


Do you dream of taking a vacation on Mars? Then, Bryce Canyon National Park is the place for you!

Get ready to spark a lifelong love of reading! This guide will help you fully utilize the National Park Adventures book, which is part of the We Love to Read! leveled readers series. These books are designed to actively engage and entertain young readers while helping to build comprehension, improve fluency, and enrich vocabulary.

With the National Park Adventures book, the reader will explore a variety of national parks. The Providing Instruction section offers suggestions for before, during, and after-reading activities. Extension ideas to expand learning are also included. Activity sheets and two assessments provide opportunities to reinforce and assess reading comprehension skills.

Awesome Advice

- Remain positive and encouraging—make reading fun!
- Set up a cozy spot for reading.
- Model fluency when you read.
- Encourage the child to point to each word as they read it.
- Use the correct vocabulary for the parts of the book (title, author, word, sentence, photograph, period, etc.).
- Pause after each page and discuss what is happening.
- Read each activity sheet out loud first to ensure understanding.
- Go over the activity sheet answers together and correct any mistakes.
- If the child becomes bored or frustrated, take a brain break!

- · Take five deep breaths.


